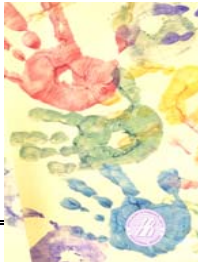

Threat Assessment Training for School Personnel Megan Evans Coleen Heim	This presentation will include an overview of the findings of the U.S. Secret Service Report on Targeted School Violence and include specific examples based on incidents across the country. The components of the threat assessment process that will be reviewed in detail include policies and procedures needed by schools to conduct an inquiry, the development of a threat assessment team, and the importance of an integrated systems approach. The training will assist in identifying and interviewing students of concern, advising students and adults on the kind of information that should be reported, and finally how the threat assessment team should investigate and analyze information to determine the level of risk and intervention required. This training will assist school personnel, law enforcement, and mental health professionals in developing an integrated systems approach. 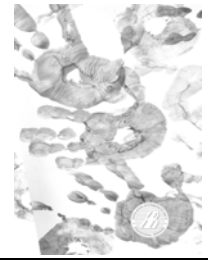

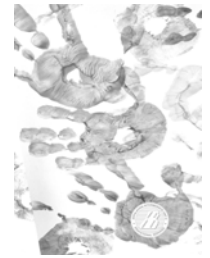

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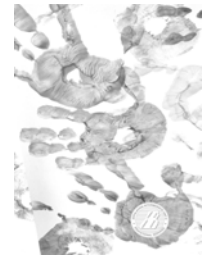
